Gli anni d'oro della dinastia Florio

Gli anni d'oro della dinastia Florio traces the key moments in the lives of the prominent members of a family that brought great distinction to Sicily. Originating from Bagnara Calabra, Paolo was the first Florio to settle in Palermo, where he established a successful shop on Via dei Materassai, known for selling spices and quinine, and frequented by Queen Caroline of Bourbon.

The *Leo Bibens*, the emblem of the Florio family, soon gained international fame. Their extraordinary economic growth is evidenced by the Florio fleet, which sailed across the oceans, their highly successful wine production, the tuna industry, the Oretea foundry, their ceramics brand, and much more.

The Florios made an indelible impact not only economically but also culturally. They played a key role in the remarkable cultural flourishing that Palermo experienced during the Belle Époque. In their luxurious and elegant villas, symbols of Liberty and Art Nouveau in Palermo, they hosted distinguished figures from around the world: kings, queens, emperors, and tsars.

The Florio history is one of a bourgeois family that ascended to aristocratic status, rivalling royal families. From the brothers Paolo and Ignazio Florio to Vincenzo Senior, the creative force behind the family's wealth, from Ignazio Florio Senior to Ignazio Florio Junior and his wife Franca Florio, the prominent figures of the Belle Époque in Palermo, to Vincenzo III, creator of the famous Targa Florio, and Raimondo Lanza di Trabia, known as a restless prince, to Giulia Florio, daughter of Ignazio and Franca, who, with her husband Achille Belloso Afan De Rivera Costaguti, opened their home in Piazza Mattei in Rome to Jewish families during the Nazi-Fascist era, saving them from certain death, and finally to Costanza Afan De Rivera, who recently passed away. The history of the Florios shows that wealth does not guarantee happiness. Their story was marked by significant entrepreneurial successes but also by deep sorrows and losses. The Florio economic empire, which thrived for a century, ultimately faced a collapse due to various reasons, becoming legendary alongside the family and their symbol.

Il cammino dei briganti in Sicilia

For some time now, various local entities have been reinterpreting the events, places, and figures associated with brigandage and banditry through the lens of heritage tourism. This phenomenon characterizes a certain approach to tourism that focuses on historical knowledge and the rediscovery and enhancement of both tangible and intangible cultural heritage. In this context, tourism contributes to preserving the past and representing a region's identity through the narration and enjoyment of sites deemed historically and culturally significant, including natural ones.

In this framework, brigandage has become part of the discussion on the nature and role of cultural heritage in shaping the historical memory of a place and its community, often highlighting events and figures that have been mythologized in popular narratives. This trend has led to the creation of trails and routes that offer tourists the opportunity to explore areas once affected by brigandage, providing insights into the region's history and cultural dimensions.

The volume edited by Vincenzo Asero, a professor of Applied Economics at the University of Catania and tourism expert, and Giovanni Nicolosi, a naturalist guide who has been working on a project to develop a Sicilian brigands' tourist trail, presents a structured itinerary in the form of a tourist guide. This guide covers the Madonie and Nebrodi Parks, focusing on the Sicilian areas most affected by brigandage.

Produced as part of the national research project Il brigantaggio rivisitato: Narrazioni, pratiche e usi politici nella storia dell'Italia moderna e contemporanea, the volume aims to introduce and explore places, episodes, and figures connected to the Maurina band. It follows a historical and memorial path from the early years after Italian unification to the siege of Gangi by Prefect Cesare Mori in 1926.

Vincenzo Asero is a researcher in Applied Economics and a professor in the Department of Political and

Social Sciences at the University of Catania. He has numerous publications on these topics, including jour-

nal articles, book contributions, and monographs for both national and international publishers. He serves

This book represents a fundamental work for anyone who wishes to understand the life and contribution of Giuseppe Alessi to the history of Sicily and Italy.

Il Patriarca Giuseppe Alessi

Giuseppe Alessi was born on October 29, 1905, in San Cataldo. In 1947, he became the first president of the Sicilian Region and was re-elected for three more terms. From 1973 to 1992, he served as the president of the Istituto dell'Enciclopedia Italiana Treccani. Raised in a family of artisans under the strong guidance of his mother, who raised eight children-later becoming professors, doctors, priests, and nuns-Alessi was initially destined for the priesthood. However, his entrepreneurial talents led his brother Modesto to suggest a different career path.

Alessi graduated in law at the age of twenty and engaged with Catholic circles in Caltanissetta and other Sicilian cities, meeting influential figures such as Bernardo Mattarella and Honorable Aldisio. During World War II, Pompeo Colajanni and he were among the few not affiliated with the Fascist Party, earning comparisons to Don Camillo and Peppone. Leonardo Sciascia referred to him as "the lawyer-priest."

The book about Giuseppe Alessi arises from an unfinished promise: in 1978, he asked his niece Sonia what she would like as a gift, and she requested a biography of him. This request led to a correspondence that was later interrupted. Alessi explained that his family had humble origins and that there was not much memory of the past. Using stories from her grandfather Leone and the correspondence with her niece, the author reconstructs the history of her maternal and paternal ancestors, spanning three generations.

The narrative explores themes of "betrayed traitors" and the intersection of the Alessi and Fasino families, both active in the Christian Democracy party. Domitilla, the eldest daughter, marries Aurelio Fasino, whose brother Mario later becomes president of the Sicilian Region. The family story is complicated by the parents' separation and a court case for marriage annulment, leading to years of suffering for Domitilla and her daughters due to the paternal family.

With determination, Domitilla founded the Novecento publishing house and bookstore in Palermo, successfully transforming her life and that of her daughters.

Sonia Fasino was born in Palermo in 1964. She is the daughter of Aurelio Fasino and Domitilla Alessi, and the eldest granddaughter of President Giuseppe Alessi. After graduating from a classical high school, she embarked on a career in publishing. In 1982, she began working at the Novecento bookstore in Palermo, which was established by Domitilla Alessi, Franco Maria Ricci, and Umberto Di Cristina. Since 1986, Sonia has held various positions at the Novecento publishing house, including roles in the press office, as sales director, and as promoter of the Novecento International Prize "La Rosa d'Oro." This role has allowed her to meet notable figures such as Jorge Luis Borges, Italo Calvino, Giulio Einaudi, Henri Cartier-Bresson, architect Ieoh Ming Pei, Yves Saint Laurent, and David Hockney. In her spare time, Sonia plays and composes music on the piano, enjoys trekking, and practices Reiki.



Living representations that go by the name of Vasacra, Scinnenza, Casazza... but which still do not change the story told in the Calvary of each town, which many municipalities have in the form of a terrace, square or churchvard.

The book therefore recounts Holy Week in Sicily from many and varied points of view, trying to analyze it province by province, starting from the religious aspect, up to the ethno-anthropological one, passing through the popular songs (Lamenti, Lamentanze) of many Good Fridays of the 'Isola, but also desserts and typical dishes (Easter lamb, eggs, cassata, spina santa, taganu). Musical bands, funeral marches, mourners, bearers, troccole, bells, mourning, viola and black. But also the joy of Easter, in the Encounter (or clash) between the Mother and the Son or in the parade of giant papier-mâché "Santoni". Crucifixes hoisted on poles and then all the characters who come to life every year: Mary, Magdalene, John, Judas, Peter.

The work, thanks to the photographic contributions, becomes a single document to be "passed" on to the new generations and to satisfy the thirst for beauty of Sicilians and those who are not Sicilians.

Francesco Daniele Miceli: from Caltanissetta, an elementary school teacher and theater director, has been involved in ethnohistorical research over the years. He publishes several titles of theater, music for children and youth with Pauline Editions.

Francesco Luca Ballarò: A native of Enna and a graduate with honors in History and Culture of Mediterranean Countries from the University of Catania with an anthropological thesis on the social character of Enna and Sicilian religious festivals, he teaches literary, historical and philosophical subjects at I and II grade secondary schools.

Una fimmina calabrese

This is the story of Lea Garofalo, the courageous woman who defied the mafia "'ndrangheta" and severed her ties with organized crime. At 36, she was abducted in Milan by order of her former partner, following a previous kidnapping attempt in Campobasso, Molise.

Her "crime"? Wanting to change her life for herself and her daughter, Denise. For her daughter, she stood up against her partner, her relatives, and her brother Floriano.

In this "country without memory," the state should be ashamed of how it has treated and continues to treat the honest citizens who have simply fulfilled their duty. These examples should not be neglected; they must bloom like pure roses, to inspire us with their passion, strength, and immense courage. The families of the victims should not be forgotten either; they must not be left alone.

To date, the mafias have killed over 150 women. It is through these women that we can imagine a different future for our country—a future free from the oppressive stench of these criminal organizations, which wield immense economic and military power and have long-standing ties with politics and institutions.

With Lea and Denise, they could do nothing.

This historical novel focuses on Ercole Michele Branciforte (1750-1814), Prince of Butera, the last member of the influential Branciforte family of Sicily. Their heraldic emblem features a lion with severed paws, inspired by the myth of Obizzo, Charlemagne's standard-bearer, who, surrounded by enemies trying to seize the sacred banner, chose to have his arms cut off but still managed to hold the flag aloft.

Ercole Branciforte is a complex figure: generous to the poor and haughty towards those who oppress, including members of his own social class. He is revered by the people as a true king and feared by the powerful and viceroys alike. His life is a blend of grandeur and disgrace—he experiences the height of courtly honour and the depths of imprisonment. The most famous episode of his life is his public demonstration of the hot air balloon.

Set in Palermo during its peak as the second city in Italy and one of the richest in Europe, the novel covers the period from the mid-18th century to the early 19th century, detailing the life of Sicily's last prince.

This is the story of a non-flammable fuel and its inventor, Ing. Gaetano Fuardo from Piazza Armerina (EN), who died in poverty. Although his heirs were later able to secure several billion francs from the French government, dark forces and major international interests prevented the widespread dissemination of this extraordinary discovery and its manufacturing formula, which is now finally known.

This innovative fuel floats on water like cork, thus avoiding marine pollution. It prevents fires in airplanes and other vehicles that use fuels. Additionally, it renders oil tankers and roadside gas stations obsolete by being marketed in solid form, similar to detergent packaging. Moreover, it cuts the cost of petroleum products by at least 50%.

Salvatore Cosentino. from Mirabella Imbaccari in the province of Catania, is a professor of Public Relations He has written over 25 books on various subjects. From 1976 to 1979, he directed the School of Social Sciences at the Institute of Sociology in Caltagirone. In 1979, he established the first chair of "Public Relations" in Italy at the same institute, following the American pragmatic approach, and published two textbooks on the subject. In 1986, he conducted seminars on "Sociology of Emigration" at the Institute of Cultural Anthropology and European Ethnology at the University of Frankfurt, Germany.
